

LAW ENFORCEMENT COMMITTEE MEETING
April 10, 2014

Chair Frank McCoy called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m. Committee members present:

McCoy confirmed that the Agenda was properly posted. Cade moved to approve the minutes of the March 12, 2014 meeting. Gobel seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

The Sheriff's invoices were reviewed and explanations provided as requested. Cade moved and Mitchell seconded a motion to pay the invoices in the sum of \$59,583.43, which motion passed unanimously.

Sheriff Spears indicated in his report that Dr. Menn has retired and the Sheriff's Office had a ceremony and presented him with a plaque. Dr. Woody is the new jail doctor and the transition appears to be going well. The surplus ATV should be available for Land and Water in the very near future, as we are obtaining a newer model ATV as a result of a drug bust.

Chief Deputy Sheriff Nathan Campbell advised the Committee that the 16 new squad computers have arrived and will be installed. The computers come with GPS units which will be beneficial in areas of the county where radio traffic is unavailable. Campbell said that he will be working on the budget for next year, starting next month. Monroe County anticipates being in their new jail as early as next spring. Jail revenues may be \$225,000 less than this year, and no jail revenues are anticipated the following year.

Sheriff Spears left the meeting for another meeting and Coroner Janet Reed arrived. Reed presented her invoices. Frank moved to pay the coroner bills, Mitchell seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

The next meeting is May 8, 2014. Mitchell moved to adjourn, Gobel seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.
