

LAW ENFORCEMENT COMMITTEE MEETING

June 9, 2011

Chairman Frank McCoy called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m. Committee members present:

Frank McCoy	Herbert Cornell
Jerry Cade	Sheriff John Spears

Cade moved to approve the minutes of the May 12, 2011 meeting. Cornell seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Cade moved to approve the Coroner vouchers in the amount of \$936.96 and Cornell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. Coroner income for May was \$550.00.

Coroner Reed's on-call secretary, Karen Sherry, has retired. She had been working a regular part-time position 9-10 hours a week, less than the 18.75 hours required to be eligible for benefits. Coroner Reed presented a request to the Law Enforcement Committee (Coroner's home committee) to hire a new regular part-time secretary at \$10.66 per hour. Cade moved to approve the request and the motion was seconded by McCoy. The motion passed unanimously.

The law enforcement bills were reviewed and explanations provided as requested. We still have not received reimbursement from Madison for officers sent to assist with the budget repair bill demonstration. It is anticipated that Madison will be asking for additional law enforcement assistance this month. Cornell moved and Mitchell seconded a motion to pay Sheriff's bills in the sum of \$56,906.35. Motion carried unanimously.

In his Sheriff's Activity Report, Sheriff Spears said that we have been working on a grant for the Click It or Ticket program. Genoa Power will be moving the spent nuclear rods and are contracting with us for security during the move. Genoa Power is also giving us a grant which we will be using to replace some tactical uniforms. We are looking at purchasing three replacement squads this year: two Ford Crown Victorias and 1 Chevrolet Caprice. The sample long-life battery that we are testing appears to be working well.

We have a date set to meet with the engineers regarding installation of the solar system over the sally port. La Crosse County has a similar system in its jail and

that system is working well. An Ozone system for cutting laundry costs has been proposed and we are looking further into that.

The next meeting is Thursday, July 14, 2011. Mitchell moved to adjourn and Cornell seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.
