

LAW ENFORCEMENT COMMITTEE MEETING
September 2, 2011

Chairman Frank McCoy called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m. Members present:

McCoy confirmed that the Agenda was properly posted.

Sheriff Spears advised the Committee that employee # 089 has retired. He is working closely with one of the dispatchers to train for interim handling of his duties until he can be replaced.

The ozone equipment for the jail is aqua fusion, operated by injecting high electrical voltage through the wash cycle water to make it more pure. It kills virus, odors, and breaks down organic matter like dirt, grease and blood. It works best with cold water and requires less soap, bleach and softeners. Makes linens last longer.

The projected return on the investment is 11 months. The ozone system itself should last 30 years. Approximately \$3,500 will be the final out of pocket expense to the county, but requires a preliminary expenditure from us of \$18,000. There is a rebate if implemented before the solar panels are completed.

This money is not in our budget for 2010. We anticipate taking the money from the jail contingency fund.

Jerry Cade moved that we spend up to \$18,000 on the ozone system for the jail. Herb Cornell seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Cade moved to adjourn, Cornell seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.
